INTRODUCTION

Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust, an NGO rooted in the heart of Arunachal Pradesh is committed to the betterment of indigenous communities in the state. Our mission revolves around the preservation, promotion and safeguarding of the rich cultural and traditional heritage of these communities. Our vision is to ensure the seamless transmission of cultural values and practices from one generation to the next. To fulfill this vision, we have established unique Gurukul-styled indigenous schools in various regions of the state. These schools offer free education to students from diverse Arunachal Pradesh communities, nurturing not only their academic growth but also a deep connection to their cultural roots.



In addition to that, in our ongoing service to these indigenous communities, we regularly organize free health camps. These camps provide a platform for the public to access vital medical services. Recently with the support of **rites Limited**, we conducted a series of health camps across various districts including East Kameng, Siang and Lower Subansiri etc. to address the healthcare needs of the local residents. Here is a brief report on each of the health camps conducted.

Report on Free Health Camp at Seppa, East Kameng District, Arunachal Pradesh

09/Oct/2023



The free health camp organized by the Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust in collaboration with RITES Limited at Seppa, East Kameng district, Arunachal Pradesh, on October 9, 2023, was a significant success with a total of 137 people benefitting from the camps held. The camp aimed to provide essential healthcare services to the local community with a focus on diagnosing and addressing prevalent health issues.



The health camp at Rang Village witnessed active participation, with a total of 65 patients seeking medical assistance. Among the major health concerns addressed were poor eyesight and body ache prevalent among the elderly population. Additionally, cases of gastritis and poor hygiene were attended to, while issues related to hypertension and blood sugar were comparatively less common in this group.

At the next venue, Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya in Wessang, a health camp was conducted, attending to the medical needs of 72 patients. The prevalent health issues addressed encompassed otitis externa (ear pain and discharge), hearing impairment, poor eyesight and cases of calcium and iron deficiency.

Report on Free Health Camp at Pulyi, Mwya, Lower Subansiri District, Arunachal Pradesh

09/Oct/2023



On October 9, 2023, free health camps were successfully organized at Pulyi and Mwya in the Lower Subansiri district of Arunachal Pradesh. The camps witnessed the active participation of 81 individuals from the local communities. The medical team, equipped with essential medicines and medical equipment, arrived promptly at 8 am, ensuring the efficient delivery of healthcare services to the attendees.

The conducted free health camps witnessed the provision of medical services to a total of 81 individuals. This included 61 male patients, and 20 female patients. The medical team also conducted 35 blood tests as part of the comprehensive health services offered during the camps.

Report on Free Health Camp at Menjwk Meqkok Rwgguu Basar, Leparada District of Arunachal Pradesh 14/Oct/2023



On October 14, under the aegis of DPCCT and with the support of RITES Limited, a free health camp was conducted at Menjwk Meqkok Rwggu Gurukul in Basar, Leparada district of Arunachal Pradesh, in collaboration with the District Hospital of Basar. The outreach of the camp extended to eight villages/areas, namely Nyobom, Pajo, Redputu, Nyigam, Ego Yamin, Kadi and Gori Complex.

The camp served a total of 69 patients, comprising 40 males and 29 females. Notably, there were no cases requiring referrals.

Report on Free Health Camp at Komsing, Siang District of Arunachal Pradesh

14-15/Oct/2023



On the 14th to 15th of October 2023, free health camps were organized at Nilung Tungko Gurukul, Pabo and Karoh village of Komsing, Siang district, Arunachal Pradesh. Organized by Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust (DPCCT) with the support of RITES Limited, the camps were successfully executed. Various medical specialists from departments such as Pediatrics, ENT, Gynecology, Dental, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Surgical and General Medicine were present. During the camps, approximately 172 patients of all ages from the surrounding regions visited the site and availed themselves of the free medical services provided.

Venue- Nilung Tungko Pabo (14th Oct)



On the 14th of October, the health camp was conducted at Nilung Tungko Gurukul in Pabo. The event saw the participation of students, parents, and the general public, all of whom availed the medical services offered. A total of 73 patients were attended to, with 51 males and 22 females seeking healthcare. Prominent health issues recorded during the camp included dental and ENT concerns.

Venue- Karoh Village (15th Oct)



On the 15th of October 2023, a health camp was organized at Karoh village of Komsing, Siang District. The camp began with an inaugural function graced by the presence of HMLA Shri Ojing Tasing. Numerous patients from the village and surrounding areas attended the camp, benefitting from various medical services provided. The total number of patients seeking healthcare during the camp was 99, with 21 being male and 78 female. Prominent health issues recorded included concerns related to eyes, dental, ENT, gynecology, body pain, among others.

Report on Free Health Camp at Kakoi, Papum Pare District of Arunachal Pradesh

11/Nov/2023



On the 11th of November 2023, a free health camp took place at Kakoi Community Hall, Kimin Circle, Papum Pare District, Arunachal Pradesh. The event saw the participation of various healthcare professionals, including Epidemiologists, Paediatricians, senior medical officers, and paramedics, providing free medical services to the attending public. The total number of patients was 119, comprising 67 males and 52 females. Prominent health issues recorded during the camp included headaches, back pain, knee pain, contact dermatitis, respiratory tract infections (RTI and URTI), gastritis, and loss of appetite.
