Er. Katung Wahge is a retired engineer from the Nyishi community in Arunachal Pradesh. He began his career in 1985 as a Chief Engineer in the Public Works Department (PWD) and was initially posted in Anini. He is associated with the Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust and serves as its Chairman. Additionally, he holds the position of president at the Indigenous Faith & Cultural Society of Arunachal Pradesh (IFCSAP), focusing on safeguarding indigenous traditions and beliefs.



As an engineer in the Arunachal Pradesh PWD, Pai Dawe has been involved in infrastructure development. Beyond his professional role, he holds positions in cultural organizations. He serves as Vice Chairman and Land donor of Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust (DPCCT), which focuses on indigenous faith preservation. He also leads Nyishi Nyidung Mwngjang Rallung, a group dedicated to reviving Nyishi culture, and is President of the National Indigenous Faith and Cultural Society (NIFCS), which unites similar organizations nationally.

The Adi community proposed the name "Nilung Tungko," the Apatani community suggested "Miji Migung Takasiiko," the Galo community proposed "Menjik Meqkok Rwgu," the Nyishi community presented "Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko," and the Tagin community proposed "Nyijik-Nyikok Nyubu Yerko." These indigenous names carry deep cultural significance and reflect the communities' commitment to preserving their traditional knowledge and way of life.

Mega Health Camp commences; numerous benefitted




The Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust (DPCCT) from 21st to 31st March 2023 organized a mega health camp in 5 of the districts in the state as a part of its initiatives to serve the community. The health camp was conducted in collaboration with NIBA hospital, with support from the CSR initiative of RITES Limited. Covering 10 villages during its course, the camp aimed to provide free healthcare services to the local population, addressing their medical needs and promoting well-being.

During the mega health camp, various medical facilities and services were made available to the attendees. This included free health check-ups, free medicine distribution, free lab tests, specialist doctor's consultations and referrals etc. The camp catered to a diverse range of health concerns ensuring that individuals received the necessary care and attention they required

GURUKULS

As part of DPCCT, we firmly believe that education is a powerful tool for bringing about positive change. Recognizing the lack of smooth transmission of traditional values among the younger generation of indiaenous communities in Arunachal Pradesh, we embarked on a journey to save the rich cultural heritage from fading away. To accomplish our mission, we decided to establish Gurukul-style schools that serve as beacons of indigenous knowledge, and modern teachings.

We are proud to have successfully established **three** such gurukuls, namely, Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko at Rang in East Kameng, Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko at Mwya in Lower Subhansiri district and Menjik Meqkok Rwgu at Basar in the Leparada district.

In the future, with the support of our esteemed donors, we envision to establish more of such Gurukuls in various parts of the state, to help protect, preserve, and promote other Indigenous Cultures and Traditions.

DPCCT is opening its fourth Indigenous school at Pabo, Komsing village in Siang district, Arunachal Pradesh. The school is set to begin functioning by July 2023, furthering our mission to preserve and promote Indigenous teachings and culture in the region.

GURUKULS AT A GLANCE



The establishment of gurukuls goes beyond imparting knowledge of traditional values; it is also about preserving and revitalizing the rich cultural heritage of Arunachal Pradesh, which is unfortunately on the brink of extinction due to the presence of gap between the older and the new generations. Our NGO stands to eradicate that gap by taking various steps. One of the steps taken is the establishment of indigenous schools (Gurukuls) in Arunachal Pradesh. At our gurukuls, we have taken a comprehensive approach by strictly following the annual NCERT syllabus while incorporating classes on the indigenous cultures of the state.

The structure and design of our gurukuls reflect a deep appreciation for traditional artistry, aiming to foster a sense of connection and pride among the students. Each class accommodates up to 30 students, and we offer education up to the 8th grade.






It is heartening to witness the ever-increasing enrollment of students year after year, signifying the growing importance and acceptance of our approach. We understand the significance of co-curricular activities in the holistic development of students. Hence, we have introduced traditional games and sports as an integral part of our school's co-curricular activities. These activities not only promote a healthy lifestyle but also provide a platform for students to explore and appreciate the diverse range of games and sports practiced by indigenous communities in Arunachal Pradesh.

These activities, such as Dapo Nyarka Sunam (Bamboo Wrestling), Dak-Dal Dakasunam (Stick Walk), and Upuk Apka Sunam (Archery), making bamboo crafts etc. not only provide a fun and engaging experience for the students but also help inculcate traditional values in them.









NYUBU NYVGAM YERKO - RANG (NYISHI TRIBE) (VILLAGE RANG, SEPPA, EAST KAMENG DISTRICT, ARUNACHAL PRADESH)



The establishment of the Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko at Rang village of Seppa town, East Kameng district of Arunachal Pradesh by DPCCT was a significant milestone for education in the region. Started in the year 2020, the school is currently running classes from I-IV with 113 students (which was 90 students last year) and follows a Gurukul-style indigenous education approach, combining the CBSE-based syllabus with classes on indigenous values and teachings. The school is open to admission only to the students belonging to the Nyishi community of the region.

The Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko school in MWYA, like its predecessor, follows a curriculum that integrates the CBSE-based syllabus with lessons on indigenous values, teachings and cultural practices.


