## Mission







## Construction



Ever since the inception of the idea to establish the Gurukul in Rang, East Kameng, Arunachal Pradesh, the team at Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust (DPCCT) has been wholeheartedly dedicated to bringing this dream project to fruition. The journey began with careful planning, meticulous preparation, and tireless efforts.

By the end of April 2020, the project had gained considerable momentum, with the DPCCT team actively involved in overseeing and monitoring the progress on site. ## Selection of the First Batch of the Staff



With the construction of the school progressing steadily, it was imperative to assemble a team of highly qualified individuals who would comprise the pioneering staff of the institution. On July 5, 2020, the Donyi Polo Cultural and Charitable Trust (DPCCT) embarked on a crucial step towards the operationalization of the Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko (NNY) School in Rang.

To ensure the selection of competent and dedicated teachers, staff members, DPCCT team organized a comprehensive interview process. The objective was to identify individuals who not only possessed the necessary academic qualifications but also shared a passion for education and a deep understanding of the cultural nuances of the indigenous communities in Arunachal Pradesh.

The interview served as an opportunity for the applicants to showcase their expertise, experience, and commitment to the objectives and values of the Gurukul. The DPCCT team diligently assessed each candidate's qualifications,

teaching abilities, communication skills, and alignment with the institution's vision.

The selection process aimed to identify individuals who would not only excel in delivering the required NCERT-based curriculum but also embody the ethos of a gurukul-styled learning environment. The



candidates were evaluated based on their potential to integrate traditional teachings alongside modern education, fostering a holistic approach to the students' development.

The DPCCT team approached the interview process with meticulous care, recognizing the significance of the first batch of staff members in shaping the school's foundation. They sought individuals who would not only contribute to the academic excellence of the institution but also serve as mentors, role models, and cultural ambassadors for the students. ## Coordination Meeting

## Enrollment of the first ever batch of students



On the 10th of October 2020, an important milestone was achieved with the enrolment of the first-ever batch of students at the Gurukul. The admission process was led by Nrmw Ashing Lamgu, the Chairman of the School Management Committee (SMC) for NNY joined by Nrmw Khya Sonam, the Vice Chairman of SMCNNY. Other members of the committee, including Nrmw Tara Kamchi, Nrmw Taro Waii, and Nrmw Papu Lamgu, also played key roles in facilitating the admissions.

Ensuring a fair and transparent selection process was of utmost importance to the interview board. They meticulously evaluated the candidates to guarantee that deserving students were granted admission. The dedication and commitment of

the interview board members were instrumental in upholding the integrity of the admission process.

services by conducting jungle clearance and digging holes for electricity connections.


With our community-oriented approach, all community members actively engaged in clearing the surrounding jungle area. By dedicating their time and efforts selflessly, they created a safer and more accessible environment for the community residing in the premises. The jungle clearance not only



enhanced the aesthetics of the area but also contributed to the overall well-being and security of the residents.

In addition to jungle clearance, the Rang Welfare Society extended their support by digging holes for electricity connections. This valuable service helped lay the foundation for the provision of electricity, a crucial aspect of modern infrastructure, at the Gurukul premises. By facilitating the setup of electricity connections, the society played a pivotal role in improving the living conditions and facilitating various activities for the benefit of the community.

## Launching of Nyishi Language Introductory Primer



According to the proposal by DPCCT (Department for Promotion of Culture and Cultural Traditions), Gurukul has introduced a unique indigenous subject that focuses on the region where the school is located. Since the indigenous teachings of the Nyishi community were traditionally passed down orally through folktales and other means, it became crucial to develop a written script for the indigenous dialects in order to preserve them from being lost over time. To accomplish this, a specialized team called the Board of Studies for Nyishi Language Development and Training (BSNLDT) was formed.

Led by Prof. Tana Showren, the Chairman of BSNLDT, the team successfully completed the preparation of the Nyishi Language Introductory Primer (Nwsw Agam Bengrap Ko Hv) using the Roman script. This primer was specifically designed for the newly inducted Class I students of the Gurukul. On the 21st of November 2020, the book was officially launched in NNY Rang, Seppa, East Kameng of Arunachal Pradesh.



The book launch event also included the first training session for the staff members. During this training, Shri Tana Showren, the Chairman of BSNLDT, conducted the first class on the "Nyishi Language Introductory

Primer." Dr. Nabam Tata and Dr. Taba Heli also shared their expertise during the event. Dr. Nabam Tata focused on "Nyishi Language Phonetic Reading Practices," while Dr. Taba Heli emphasized the "Importance of Spirituality in Indigenous Knowledge Systems." The event spanned from the 21st to the 25th of November, allowing for comprehensive training and knowledge exchange.

Overall, this initiative aims to revitalize and preserve the indigenous dialects of the Nyishi community by introducing a written script and incorporating it into the curriculum of the Gurukul.

1st Orientation Course for the Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff of Nyubu Nyvgam Gurukul



The 1<sup>st</sup> ever Orientation course for the teaching as well as the non-teaching staff of the Gurukul was organised on 21<sup>st</sup> of November 2020, wherein all the selected staff members were sensitized on various roles and responsibilities they bear with their assigned portfolios. Various essential activities were undertaken in the event in order to prepare the team for their tasks ahead. The valuable guidance by the resource persons and the individual as well as group activities were incorporated in the event to ensure the members understand their crucial roles in building up the future of the indigenous school as well as the students enrolled in it.

On 26th November 2020, a valedictory function was held to mark the completion of the program. It was graced by notable guests including Shri Abhishek Pravimal Poulumatla (IAS, Deputy Commissioner of East Kameng district), Er. Mara Kocho (Chief Engineer, BSNL Ambala, Haryana) and Er. Pai Dawe (President,

NIFCS). The Deputy Commissioner distributed certificates to all the trainees, recognizing their dedication and contribution to the school's development.

## Inauguration of Nyubu Nyvgam Yerko Rang




